

TOWN OF NAUVOO
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REGULAR SCHEDULED COUNCIL MEETING

The Nauvoo Town Council met for a Regular Scheduled Council meeting on March 20, 2026 at 10:00 a.m. at the Nauvoo Town Hall. Mayor Terry Burgett in the chair with Clerk Nicole Garner acting as recording secretary. Mayor Burgett called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m. The following council members were present upon roll call: Olivia Allbritton, Deb Barton, Christian Dill, Denice Perry, and Terry Burgett. Council member Melinda Wills was absent. Visitors in attendance were Nick McDonald, Matt Sanford, and Amy Frederickson. Barton opened the meeting with a prayer and Allbritton led in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Burgett gave the floor to guest Amy Frederickson to speak on the upcoming America250AL celebration. Ms. Frederickson spoke about the different celebrations that will be happening throughout the county.

Dill moved to approve the financial statements for February. Barton seconded the motion and all were in favor.

Dill moved to approve the minutes of 2/20/2026 and 3/4/2026 as presented. Barton seconded the motion and all were in favor.

Mayor Burgett presented Resolution 20260320-1: A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE USE OF OPIOID REMEDIATION FUNDS FOR THE PURCHASE OF LIFE-SAVING EQUIPMENT. The resolution allowed for the fire departments \$5,000 funding from the Walker County Commission combined with the town's Opioid funds to be used on critical life-saving devices, supplies, and supporting equipment to enhance emergency medical response and improve outcomes for individuals experiencing opioid-related or other life-threatening emergencies. Dill moved to adopt and approve Resolution 20260620-1. Allbritton seconded the motion and upon a roll call vote was as follows: YEAS – Allbritton, Barton, Dill, Perry; NAYS – None. Motion carried.

Increasing annual fire dues was discussed. No motion made on the topic. Will discuss more at next meeting.

Allbritton moved to approve the \$265 fee for the clerk to attend the clerk's spring institute online. Dill seconded the motion and upon a roll call vote was as follows: YEAS – Allbritton, Barton, Dill, Perry; NAYS – None. Motion carried.

Barton explained that she had contacted a few electrical companies to provide the need electrical work at the community center and that only one company replied. Redbird Electrical Services provided a quote of \$2,655 to install outlets, outside lights, and dividing breakers.

Perry moved to suspend the rules of the council for the immediate consideration of the quote. Dill seconded the motion and upon a roll call vote was as follows: YEAS – Allbritton, Barton, Dill, Perry, Burgett; NAYS – None. Motion carried. Dill moved to accept Redbird Electrical Services quote and to allow up to \$2,700 to be spent for the electrical work at the community center. Perry seconded the motion and upon a roll call vote was as follows: YEAS – Allbritton, Barton, Dill, Perry; NAYS – None. Motion carried.

Mayor Burgett presented Resolution 20260320-2: A RESOLUTION TO SUPPORT THE DECLARING A SURPLUS AND DISPOSAL OF ITEMS OF THE TOWN OF NAUVOO. The resolution declared items as surplus and no longer needed for municipal purposes and would approve the mayor to dispose of the following items: 16 pews, 1 prayer bench, 1 pulpit, 3 blue wooden chairs, 1 half round table. Dill moved to approve and adopt Resolution 20260320-2. Perry seconded the motion and upon a roll call vote was as follows: YEAS – Allbritton, Barton, Dill, Perry; NAYS – None. Motion carried.

Dill moved to replace both thermostats at the community center. Allbritton seconded the motion and upon a roll call vote was as follows: YEAS – Allbritton, Barton, Dill, Perry; NAYS – None. Motion carried.

Mayor Burgett presented Resolution 20260320-3: A RESOLUTION TO SUPPORT THE DECLARING AS SURPLUS AND DISPOSAL OF ITEMS OF THE NAUVOO VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT. The resolution declares the items as surplus and no longer needed for municipal services and allows for the mayor and/or fire chief to dispose of the following items: a 1978 GMC and a 1985 Ford F37. Dill moved to approve and adopt Resolution 20260320-3. Barton seconded the motion and upon a roll call vote was as follows: YEAS – Allbritton, Barton, Dill, Perry; NAYS – None. Motion carried.

Mayor Burgett presented Resolution 20260320-4: A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF A FORMAL AMENDMENT REQUEST TO RETURN UNUSED COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT FUNDS TO ALABAMA DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC & COMMUNITY AFFAIRS. The resolution allowed for all unused funds from the CDBG to be returned. The original construction budget totaled \$277,463 while the contractor's bid and total expenditure for demolition amounted to \$159,000. Dill moved to adopt and approve Resolution 20260320-4. Barton seconded the motion and upon a roll call vote was as follows: YEAS – Allbritton, Barton, Dill, Perry; NAYS – None. Motion carried.

Mayor Burgett read aloud a proclamation that recognizing Nauvoo as a Semiquincentennial City in Walker County. The America250AL celebration was then discussed. Dill moved to have the America250AL Flag Raising Ceremony to be held directly after the car show on June 20th. Allbritton seconded the motion and upon a roll call vote was as follows: YEAS – Allbritton, Barton, Dill, Perry; NAYS – None. Motion carried.

Mayor Burgett reminded the council of the Walker Area Community Foundation meeting to be held on March 30th at 6:00 pm.

Dill moved to adjourn the meeting. Barton seconded the motion. Meeting adjourned at 11:03 am.
